Rally 2010

Judging by the responses so far, many of us will be attending the Rally next year in Hobart. It would be an ideal time to arrange your own family reunions - there is always plenty of time for chatting and catching up during the various events, so plan now to join us and make it the best Rally yet!

The dates have been confirmed as 30th June – 4th July; despite it being winter in Tasmania we feel we are more likely to get support from US members as well if the dates are the usual ones. As has been pointed out by the Clan Chief, Irish weather is not guaranteed even in summer, so why should it be a problem in Hobart!

We will be based at a city hotel and will stay overnight at Port Arthur on Thurs, returning to Hobart for Friday and Saturday nights. Participants may wish to add Tuesday and Sunday nights at the same hotel. We encourage visitors to stay and tour independently.

Getting to Tasmania

Direct flights to Hobart are available from Melbourne and Sydney, and take one and two hours respectively.

There is an overnight ferry from Melbourne to Devonport in the north of Tasmania and takes 12 hours. If you bring a car on the ferry, the registration number of the car is required at the time of booking, so bringing a hire car over is not an option. Hire cars are available at the terminal at Devonport. There is also a coach. Hobart is a three and a half hour trip by road from Devonport.

Weather

July is winter in Hobart.

Hobart is situated at latitude 42°50'S and longitude 147°20'E. Its latitude equates with that of Rome and Salt Lake City in the northern hemisphere, but the climate is more moderate. Hobart has a mild, temperate, maritime climate with four distinct seasons.

Weather	July
Mean daily maximum	14.4°C (58°F)
Mean daily minimum	4.5°C (40°F)
Average rainfall	52.8mm

Because of its southerly latitude, the seasons are much more evident in Tasmania than they are in the rest of Australia. While the mountains are sprinkled with snow in the winter, at sea level the daytime temperatures are clear, crisp days are ideal for some outdoor activities. Normal clothing eg slacks and sweatshirt, for indoors, topped with a waterproof and windproof jacket for outdoors is generally sufficient. For longer outdoor activities, hats, scarf and gloves may be helpful if you feel the cold.

DNA Project

The DNA project is growing steadily – we have 92 samples now! To encourage those who might still be a little hesitant about joining, we have a terrific success story from one of our existing members, Nita Williams – thanks for writing it up, Nita!

DNA testing

Family history research has always interested me and I started around 20 years ago, researching my husbands and my own family. We are both second and third generation Australians, so it didn't take long to finish my research in Australia. Where I lived at the time the only place to go was the local Family History Library belonging to the Seventh Day Adventists and the library was only opened one and a half days a week.

I have been a member of Clan Egan for a few years now and when it was suggested having a male member of your family DNA tested, I thought it a great idea. I had gone as far as I could with our Egan family and unless I found a rich Egan who owned land or left a will I didn't think I could go any further. My Cousin, Robert Henry Egan who lives in the next town agreed to have his DNA tested. The results of the 25 marker yDNA returned showing matches, one removed to Egans and Agins around the world. Some of these "genetic cousins" we met at the 2008 Egan Rally in Ireland.

My husband Michael saw the results and decided to have his DNA tested, as we had hit a brick wall with his Great Grandfather Frank Williams. He joined the Williams name group at Family Tree DNA, sent in his test kit, and waited for the results.

The results to our surprise when they returned didn't show a match with any Williams, but a couple of names stood out as interesting, the names COON and CONE. The test was a 37 marker which showed exact matches to two people of these names, both living in America. This would mean it is an 83.49% chance Mike shares a common ancestor within the last four generation with these two people. Four generations back would take us back to Sylvanus, Frank's father.

To show how we may have solved our problem of Frank Williams, I will tell you a little of what we knew of him. Frank was born somewhere near Rome in Oneida Co., New York State on 28th August 1834 to parents Sylvanus Williams and Frances Coan. When he was 19 years of age, he joined the Regular Army "the spirit of adventure seized him and he enlisted in the army and spent two terms enlisted – ten years in all – in Mexico, Arizona and Texas scouting after Indians" [this information was written in his obituary]. We knew he fought in the American Civil War on the side of the Union Army and was captured by the Confederates and held as a prisoner of war. He escaped with two companions and made it to Mexico and then to New York and in 1863 he deserted from the Army and came to Australia in 1864.

I requested a search from the NARA, which is the National Archives in America, for a search of Frank

Williams amongst their lists of Union Soldiers but there was no results which matched my information.

I Googled Franks parents names Sylvanus Williams and Frances Coan with a result returning Sylvanus Coan and Frances Williams, which was more in keeping with the DNA results. The results came from ancestry.com Family Trees, which is a site where you can look for a name and if someone is researching these names you can view their results. The information had:

Sylvanus Coan born in Connecticut and died in Parish, Oswego Co., New York State. Oswego Co. is next to Oneida Co. in New York State. Frances was his fourth wife and they had six children, the youngest being Ira Smith Coan born 28th August 1836 in Parish, Oswego Co. New York State. In all, Sylvanus had four wives and 15 children.

I searched the National Archives site for Army records on the internet and asked them to search for Ira Smith Coan's records, which they found and sent back via snail mail. I found he was in the Army for two terms and the second term he was signed up in Fort Bliss Texas in 1860. It also showed he deserted in New York City in 1863.

I subscribe to a site on the internet called footnote.com which is a site downloading records from the National Archives and when I searched for Ira, I found an application for a pension by his mother, Fanny. When I received the documents, 14 pages, I found many similarities with Frank's information. Ira's birth date is written down as 28th August 1836 but when he joined the Army in 1855 his age was 21 years, which made his birth year 1834 and he also joined for two terms. He was in Fort Bliss Texas when he joined for the second term and then the war broke between the North and South. He became a prisoner of war under the Confederacy for two years and then escaped to Mexico, where the American Consul arranged passage to New York. He deserted in 1863 while in New York City. With this information we believe the two men, Frank Williams and Ira Coan could be the same person.

At present we are in contact with one of the persons who have an exact 37 marker and we are exchanging information. He has an ancestor who lived in Oneida Co., New York in 1820 to 1840. Now we need to find the connection between both lines to become real "cousins". If it wasn't for Mike having his DNA tested, we would never have thought to reverse the surnames, which gave us a new line to research. Williams at the best of times is a hard name to research especially in Wales, there are so many of them, hopefully Coan will give us more results.

Research

Kevin Egan has been keeping us up-to-date with useful new websites. An important one is the online access to Victorian wills and probate papers through the website of the Public Record Office Victoria.

In the past you had to attend the office in person to find the index number of the probate records and look at them on paper; now you can search the website by name and find a digital version of the file for the period 1841-1925; older records have all been digitised but later ones are still in progress. The estates of people who died intestate, had to go through an administration process rather than probate and their files are not yet available online, although you can find the index number of the files.

Kevin has also created a list of burials in Kingower Cemetery, Victoria from Ancestry.com; please let us know if you want us to look anyone up – the list is not exclusively Egans.

Finally, Kevin also had access to Queensland Electoral Rolls and has extracted Egans and variants for 1880 to 1884. The list (at the end of the newsletter) shows surname, given name, qualification (F/hold = Freeholder, householder = h/hold, Res = residence), residence (some of which were cattle stations), Queensland State Electoral District, Year and Fiche No.

TERRY EGAN : Soldier with sense of duty

Born: Tamworth, NSW, May 13, 1936

Died: Toowoomba, August 29, 2008

AUSTRALIAN Army Warrant Officer

Terry Egan and US chopper pilot Mark Skulborstad each believed the other died in an attack on the joint Australian American compound at Hue, in South Vietnam, in 1967.

Warrant Officer Egan, a member of the Australian Army Training Team, found his close friend's wings badge and cap and took them home with him, pinning the badge to his unit shield after being told he was one of three Americans killed.

Years later, he heard his mate was badly injured but had survived and in 1999 tracked him down.

Mr Skulhorstad believed the Australian had been killed.

He visited Brisbane and Toowoomba for successive Anzac Day commemorations, where the two old comrades marched together.

Terence John Egan, DCM was the only son of Tom and Val Egan. He had a younger sister, Maureen.

His childhood was spent in the hills above East Tamworth, hunting rabbits and riding horses.

He was also a voracious reader and by the age of 10 had read the entire Tamworth Children's Library and was given special membership of the adult the section. He considered school a source of boredom and amused himself creating his unique style of mischief. During his school years he also gained his first experience of military as a member of the school cadet corps. He met Carol, his future wife, when she was 15 and climbed into a Staghound armoured vehicle he was showing a friend. He accused her of deliberately standing on his head as she tried to climb aboard and she assessed him as arrogant.

However, the two were to meet again years later when she accepted his invitation to attend the 12th/16th Hunter River Lancers Ball in 1959 at which Princess Alexandra was the guest of honour.

Romance blossomed and they married at Tamworth in 1960.

Mr Egan worked in a variety of jobs including as an aerial photographer and salesman before enlisting in the Australian Regular Army in 1969.

He served in Vietnam as a warrant officer in the Australian Army Training Team leading and training reconnaissance missions behind enemy lines. His exemplary service was recognised by the award of the Distinguished Conduct Medal, the South Vietnamese Cross of Gallantry with Silver Star twice and the Vietnamese Army Medal of Honour. His unit was once trapped behind enemy lines but he and his men were rescued by Mr Skulborstad who landed his chopper under enemy fire to save the Australians.

It was a foundation of their friendship renewed after 31 years.

After the war, Mr Egan remained in the army for 20 years as a jungle warfare instructor and army aviation instructor. He and Carol moved to Canungra, Papua New Guinea, Townsville, Momington, Sydney, Oakey and finally retired to Glencoe, near Toowoomba. He was instrumental in establishing the Museum of Australian Army Flying at Oakey during the 1980s and in 1990 was named Army Aviator of the year. Later in life, he had serious heart problems and in 1994 he became the 91st heart transplant recipient at The Prince Charles Hospital.

Once home in Toowoomba, he helped to found the Toowoomba Cardiac Rehabilitation Program for heart transplant patients.

He also became a chaplain to various veterans' associations including the Australian Army Training Team Vietnam Association, the Toowoomba RSL and the National Servicemen's Association, assisting veterans and their families. Colleagues say he will be remembered for his mischievous sense of humour, his unbounded compassion, his dedication to his wife and family and his loyal service to his country.

He is survived by his wife, daughters Tracy and Michelle and nine grandchildren.
